James W. Darlington - "Peopling the Post-Revolutionary New York Frontier"

Vast areas of central, western, and northern New York drew scores of thousands of settlers in the first few decades following the American Revolution. It is frequently assumed this early wave of settlers were New England Yankees. Many were, but a good many others were not. This presentation will examine where the settlers came from, where they settled, their migratory behavior along the way and to a limited extent, the imprint the various groups made on the Upstate region that remain evident today.
